CALL FOR PAPERS

Abstract State Machines (ASMs) provide a rich framework for formalizing complex system behavior at arbitrary abstraction levels. For the ASM 2001 Workshop, the 8th in the series of international ASM workshops (see www.upb.de/cs/asm/ws/), we solicit unpublished contributions (also preliminary reports on ongoing research) on fundamentals of the ASM method and its applications in all areas of software and systems engineering. Of particular interest are advanced techniques and supporting tools for the *design, specification, refinement, verification* and *analysis* of complex HW/SW systems, system description languages, programming languages, and communication protocols.

Conference Proceedings

It is anticipated that the final selected full papers will be published (in line with prior EUROCAST meetings) as Springer LNCS volume.

Journal Publication for Best Papers

Additionally, after the workshop some best papers will be selected and their authors will be invited to contribute to a special ASM issue of Springer's *Journal of Universal Computer Science (JUCS)*, to appear in the Winter of 2001.
