The department is committed to excellence in research and higher education.

- Its study programmes are internationally recognized for the excellence of the training provided. Throughout the Department's multidisciplinary approach, students take part in a coherent curriculum that includes but is not limited to microeconomics, macroeconomics, econometrics, mathematics, statistics and applied economics. In addition to the theoretical training, the Department supports its students in the obtention of the practical skills needed to conduct qualified analytical and investigational work in the public administration, at research institutes, in financial institutions, and in private and non governmental organisations, both in France and internationally.
- The department's research activities are organized within the Center for Economic Research on Governance, Inequality and Conflict. The research conducted within the center is related to governance, equality, information dissemination and conflict resolution.

TRAINING OFFER

The ENS de Lyon Diploma

- provides a common framework for studying as a "Normalien"
- leads to the award of a Master's degree
- includes international study
- is multi-disciplinary
- emphasizes research-based learning
- allows each student to build a personalized study programme in relation to their career goals.

• The Pre-master in Economics

aims to develop fundamental knowledge in economics. The program introduces students to microeconomics,

macroeconomics, econometrics, mathematics, statistics, and the foundations of academic research. It is designed to combine theoretic learnings with practical application.

• The Master in Economics

provides students with a solid basis in economic theory, economics, statistics and econometrics. The quantitative and qualitative skills will allow the students to analyse empirical data and evaluate public and economic policy.

• The PhD in Economics

is our most advanced program. The students benefit from one of the world's highest faculty-to-student ratio, individual tutoring, and are immersed within the scientific life of the Department and our research center.
