- **Configurations of European fairs.** Merchants, objects, routes (1350-1600)
Konfigurationen europäischer Messen. Händler, Objekte, Routen (1350-1600)
- **Franco-German project in the humanities and social sciences** funded by the ANR and the DFG (Projektnummer 430627254)

The project aims to take up the history of European trade fairs from the perspective of market integration. The project will study the relational dimensions (and their developments) of these markets, as well as the role and behaviors of the different key players. The exchanges will be mapped in their spatial and temporal dimensions by the association of a database integrating the collected data (salesmen present at trade fairs, objects traded, itineraries and temporalities) and a GIS. This digital side of the project will rely on the French team for Digital Humanities and the German team for Spatial Humanities.

Archaeological site of La Couronne (Molles, Allier)

- **The fortified establishment of Height of La Couronne** has been the subject of excavations led by Damien Martinez (Lyon 2, CIHAM) since 2010. The aim of the new 2020-2022 program is to continue to document the history of the site, from the public fortress of Late Antiquity to the small rural fortification at the turn of the second millennium.

Website Understanding Islam: Religion, History, Debates

- **This project aims at creating a set of digital resources on Islam** made available on a free and open website to enrich the public debate on social issues related to the Muslim religion with reliable and objective resources.
