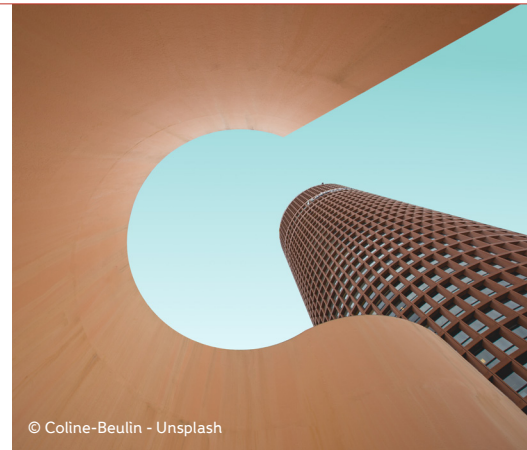

FROM THE LABORATORY TO THE SOCIO-ECONOMIC WORLD

- **Gender:** Construction of gender identities and gender difference, their effects in terms of inequality and intersectional thinking.
- **Work:** Globalization of productive activities, increase of information and communication technologies, generalization of management based on principles of flexibilization, etc.
- **Health:** Analysis of social constructions and health negotiations today.
- **Visual methodology:** Reflect and project the place of the image.

FOCUS ON

The Max Weber Center conducts collaborative research projects at local, national and international levels:

- The COVIDHEPAD program (funding CHU of Besançon) looks at issues relating to the end of life and death in nursing homes, related to the Covid-19 epidemic in France.
- COVIPRI (funding Directorate of Penitentiary Administration) analyzes COVID-19 in prison.
- EMOTION (funded by the Ministry of Culture) studies how children's emotions are socialized by cultural products.
- PRIMSOC (ANR funding) focuses on socially differentiated socializations during early childhood.
- The GEM project (ANR funding) measures gender equality in the media.
- CALOT (ANR funding) studies the consequences of forced loyalty.

Partnership contracts

The Max Weber Center maintains close institutional and scientific links with many partners and research networks.

- It is a member of GIS ATLAST, Gender, GESTURES, ILVV, Democracy and Participation, and Hybrida-IS International Network.
