If you witness sexual and sexist violence report it

Distract

Go up to the victim and give them a reason to escape from the situation: say that someone needs to speak to him/her or say that you need to speak to them. Any excuse is good to get the victim out of danger.

Wait until it's safe to call

Wait until the situation you have just witnessed has calmed down, then ask the victim if they are ok or phone one of the emergency services listed below once the person is safe. It's never too late to report violent or inappropriate sexual behavior.

Take action

Criticize negative behavior. Tell the person to stop and ask the victim if they are ok. Inform several people if possible.

Delegate

Speak to a person in authority so that they can look after the situation immediately or call for help.
